
Who May Apply for Loans

Loan Terms

- Maximum loan amount is \$100,000
- Maximum loan length is 10 years
- Maximum interest rate is 3%
- Lender may charge customary fees
- Lender may require collateral
- Borrower must meet lending criteria
- Additional local limitations may apply



Each year \$10 million is available for loans in Minnesota. The AgBMP Loan Program is funded by the Minnesota State Legislature, the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and is administered through the Minnesota Department of Agriculture.

No grants are given by this program.

Application Process

- 1. The borrower proposes a project to the county for approval.
- 2. If the borrower is eligible and the project addresses local water quality problems, the county approves the project and refers it to a participating local lender.
- The lender evaluates the financial details of the project and decides whether to offer a loan.
- 4. The lender and the borrower negotiate the terms of the loan.
- 5. The borrower completes the project.
- 6. The borrower provides bills and receipts for the cost of the project to the lender.
- '. The lender requests money from the AgBMP Loan Program.
- . The AgBMP Loan Program sends the requested money to the lender.
- 9. The lender issues the loan to the borrower.
- 10. The borrower pays back the lender.
- 11. The lender pays back the AgBMP Loan Program.

How can landowners afford to fix septic systems?

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture has a low interest loan program that can help landowners pay their septic system repair bill. This loan program is the Agricultural Best Management Practices Loan Program (AgBMP). Over the last 5 years, the AgBMP Loan Program has funded the repair or installation of 1,600 septic systems across the state.

This program can provide a 3% interest loan for virtually any project that reduces or eliminates water pollution, including septic systems. The maximum loan amount is \$100,000 with repayment up to 10 years. With these high limits, we can fund both smaller, individual systems and large, multi-connection cluster systems. We can pay for materials, equipment, and other installation expenses and can even buy land for the system, if needed.

The AgBMP Loan Program simply makes fixing septic systems more affordable for landowners. There are no eligibility requirements other than to have an <u>existing</u> non-compliant system and adequate credit to obtain from a participating bank. We cannot assist with new systems at new home sites.

The program is administered locally by Soil and Water Conservation Districts or county Environmental Offices. The state's AgBMP Loan Program simply provides money to the banks which in turn issues loans to the landowner to finance the work you do.

Funds from the AgBMP Loan Program are available in most counties and we have more than 200 participating lenders plus their multiple branch offices. If you have a client that may be interested in a low interest loan to finance their septic system, please refer them to their county or any of the local lenders listed on the back side of this page. I have listed county contacts near you and local participating lenders in your area. Please contact me if you need information for other areas.

The AgBMP Loan Program has be assisting landowners since 1995, providing more than \$135 million for more than 9,500 loans to stop pollution and the program will continue long into the future.
