

Coming Soon - Tree Seedlings and Spring Brush Pickup

The City office has started to receive inquiries about whether two popular spring programs will be offered again this year - free tree seedlings from the Minnesota DNR and a city-wide brush pickup day. The answer to both is yes!

The City expects to receive 8 different varieties of tree seedings late April/early May and will be FREE to residents. Replenishing trees lost to disease and age is an important part of sustaining North Oaks natural environment for years to come. Information on how/where to pick up seedlings will be shared as soon as we receive the delivery date from the MN State Forestry.

The brush pick-up program will take place on Thursday, May 30th, and will offer residents a discounted rate for brush pickup by Budget Tree Service. If all the brush is not picked up that day, work will continue the following day. Agreement waivers must be in by Tuesday, May 28th. Refer **HERE** for more details and estimated cost. Ramsey County Roads - Potholes Issues

The spring season can be frustrating to many drivers as they go down the roads as they can be a bit bumpy. If you come across potholes that are deep, please take some time to report them to the appropriate agency so they can be patched.

First, determine the location and type of roadway the pothole is on, State, County, or City roadway? Next, go to that agency to report the pothole. Many can easily be reported online. See below for State and Ramsey County pothole reporting.

Total Solar Eclipse - Monday April 8th

This Monday, April 8th between 1 - 3 p.m. a total eclipse of the Sun will take place in parts of the U.S. This scientific event occurs when the moon completely covers the sun, which effects sunlight, air temperature, animal behavior and causes temporary darkness. While Minnesota is not in the direct path, we may still see a more limited visible effect. View here for the timing and path across the United States. The next total solar eclipse will not be until August 2026.

Counties added to spring burning restrictions as wildfire risk increases in the Northwest via MN DNR 4/5/2024

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has expanded the area subject to open burning restrictions of vegetative debris, as warm and dry weather spreads throughout the state. This kind of burning is the number one cause of wildfires in Minnesota and burning restrictions help reduce wildfire risk. This includes Ramsey County.

The DNR will not issue permits for the open burning of brush or yard waste in these counties until restrictions are lifted.

"Wildfire danger is especially high in spring because dormant or dead



If people need to dispose of vegetation or yard waste, Harrison said composting, chipping, or taking brush to a collection site are all good options. For more information, visit the composting for woodland owners page of the DNR website (mndnr.gov/wildfire/prevention/debriscomposting.html).

People cause 90% of wildfires in Minnesota. Due to the high wildfire potential this spring, people should be careful with anything that can cause a spark, especially on dry, windy days. If a fire rekindles or escapes, the person who set it is liable for any damage caused, as well as for wildfire suppression costs.

Burning restrictions will be adjusted as conditions change. For more information

vegetation from the previous year has dried out and there is no snow protection," said Karen Harrison, DNR wildfire prevention specialist. "Recent snow and rain provided temporary relief in some areas, but cured grasses and downed leaves can dry out quickly. Once the landscape 'greens up,' fire danger goes down – but until then, burning restrictions reduce the potential for unintended wildfire starts."

Highlights from the 4.11.2024 City Council Meeting

Highlights from the Thursday, April 11, 2024 City Council Meeting at 7 p.m. include:

- Council heard from 2 residents regarding current animal licensing ordinance, and Red Forest Way utility proposed connection. Council approved City April financials, arborist and mechanical license applications, 2023 audited financials, and accepted donation for the Aging in Place Open House.
- Deputy Lassegard presented his monthly report. (see below)
- Approved Resolutions 1510 and 1511 for CUP for building height in excess of 35 feet for properties located at 1 and 2 Sherwood Trail
- Approved Resolution 1512 for CUP for garage size



- in excess of 1,500 square feet and building addition at 70 West Pleasant Lake Road
- Approved Resolution 1513 and 1514 for septic variance at 4 Dove Lane and 6 Badger Lane
- Discussed and approved Ordinance 146* and Summary Resolution 1515 amending City Code Title XV, Chapter 151, regarding solar energy systems
- Discussed and approved Ordinance 147* and summary Resolution 1516 amending City Code, Title XV, Chapter 151, regarding building height and setbacks in the RSL - Residential Single-Family Low Density District
- **Ordinances 146 and 147 can be found by scrolling down to the most recent ordinances on the City website, with a summary published in the 4.23.2024 edition of the Shoreview Press.
- Discussed and approved Resolution 1517 supporting retention of City zoning authority. This will be sent to the State legislature to support North Oaks desire to maintain control of local zoning at City level.
- Discussed and approved Resolution 1518 withdrawing Comp Plan amendment request to Metropolitan Council for public sewer at Red Forest Way.
- Councilor Azman noted discussion of bonding at Fire Board meeting. Brief conversation regarding preferred method for bonding of the proposed Lake Johanna Fire Station.
- Councilor Shah noted Fire Board is looking at different governance model, encourages families to participate in Earth Day activities and take part in the free tree seedling program once they arrive at City Hall.
- Councilor Watson will schedule sub-committee meeting with the Ramsey County Sheriff office to discuss contract. He also noted the importance of communication with residents regarding water conservation as enter new agreements with White Bear township.
- Mayor Wolter reminded residents of Brush pick-up day taking place late May. She also thanked the City Attorney for keeping Council up to date on legislative matters and encouraged residents to call their representatives if do not agree with the content of the bills taking away local authority for zoning matters.

County Road J & I-35E Interchange Reconstruction Scheduled for 2025 County Road J from Centerville Road to Otter Lake Road – including the interchange with I-35E – is scheduled for reconstruction in 2025. This construction may affect North Oaks residents in the northern portion of the City, including Preserve Trail, Sherwood Road, Rapp Farm, and Waverly Gardens. Ramsey County is leading the project in partnership with the Minnesota Department of Transportation, Anoka County, White Bear Township, North Oaks and Lino Lakes.



The existing I-35E and County Road J interchange –and the surrounding area – has several safety, congestion and access issues that impact pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists. Additional development is expected near the interchange in the next five years, which will increase traffic and worsen safety issues. Three areas are targeted for improvement:

- The I-35E and County Road J interchange.
- County Road J from Centerville Road to Otter Lake Road.
- Centerville Road from County Road J to North Ash Street.

Notable:

- Attempt to lure child into a car in Rapp Farm. No suspect identified.
- Reminds parents to speak to children about stranger safety, role play scenarios with them, buddy up if possible, and be sure they know their own address and phone number. Don't be afraid to tell an adult if approached.
- Animal complaints it is the homeowner's responsibility to keep pets in own yard and allow walkers and other residents safe passage on roads.
- Reminder there is no fishing on Pleasant Lake per DNR Regulations and North Oaks ordinance. Violators are subject to ticketing.

- Be a hard target: Keep garage doors closed (even when home or out on walks) and cars locked that are in driveways.


Hodgson Road / County Road J -Roundabout Construction


Anoka County has just placed roadwork signs to notify drivers of upcoming construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Hodgson Road and County Road J/Ash Street. This will impact the intersection from April 22nd through August 31, 2024.

Impacted area includes:

- Hodgson Road closure (Emil Avenue to Rohavic Lane)
- County Road J closure for westbound traffic (Grotto Street to Kent Street)
- County Road J open to eastbound traffic

Official detour signs may take you along Anoka County main roads as detour. We recommend North Oaks Rapp Farm residents that use Hodgson Road for their daily commute, **take**

Sherwood Road an alternate to avoid the intersection under construction.

From Highway 96 area, if you are going north on Hodgson Road take a right (east) on Sherwood Road, and then a right (east) on County Rd J/Ash Street to reach the Rapp Farm community. Household Hazardous Waste Mobile Collections Sites Now Open

Free household hazardous waste mobile collection sites are offered at various cities in Ramsey County from April - October.

Many household products you use to clean your kitchen and bathroom, maintain your car and home, and control animals and insects contain hazardous materials.



On Fridays and Saturdays throughout each month, the collection site will be available to assist residents in disposing of household products safely and conveniently. It is illegal to dispose of household hazardous waste in the garbage.

2024 mobile collection sites include:

April - Maplewood May - Arden Hills June - White Bear Lake July - Arden Hills August - Summit Hill (Saint Paul) September - Saint Paul October - Maplewood

Drive Safely during North Oaks Roadwork


Please note that NOHOA is improving the following streets this year as part of their annual project (map also attached):

Free Minnesota State Park Day - Saturday, April 27th

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is hosting their next free park day on Saturday, April 27th. On this day, vehicle permit fees will be waived at all 74 state parks and recreation areas.

Metropolitan Mosquito Control District trucks, helicopters, and staff will be out in neighborhoods and parks this spring and summer working to reduce mosquito-borne disease and annoyance.

Press Release from Metropolitan Mosquito Control District (MMCD)



SAINT PAUL - There was nothing normal about the winter of 2023-24. Unseasonably warm temperatures and a lack of snowfallfor much of December through February gave way to relatively cool temperatures and moderate precipitation in late March and early April. In early spring, mosquitoes tend to stay in the water as larvae for longer, but as air temperatures rise, they begin to emerge as adult mosquitoes. The warming expected in the coming weeks, means adult mosquito activity will increase in late April and May.

The Metropolitan Mosquito Control District (MMCD) will be conducting surveillance and treatment activities in your community to reduce the risk of disease and annoyance in an environmentally-sensitive manner. Each year field staff at MMCD monitors and treats wetlands that breed mosquitoes with a fleet of trucks and helicopters. Many of our seasonal staff begin working in April and residents of the seven county metro area may notice the green or white trucks with the MMCD logo or staff on bikes or on foot wearing brightly colored "Mosquito Control" shirts.

At times MMCD employees may need to cross private property for access to check and treat areas for mosquito larvae. If you have questions about mosquito control activities or concerns about an employee, please call the MMCD front desk at (651) 645-9149 or visit MMCD.org.

Some of the activities that MMCD may be doing in your community include:

- Wetland surveillance determining if ponds or swamps have mosquito larvae present.
- Catch basin surveillance pulling off grates and inspecting neighborhood catch basins to determine if mosquito larvae are present.
- Ground larval treatments applying control materials to a wetland with a hand spreader or backpack.
- Helicopter larval treatments applying control materials to a wetland via helicopter.
- UAS/drone larval treatments applying control materials via drone.
- Catch basin treatments applying control materials to neighborhood catch basins.
- Setting or collecting traps surveillance helps MMCD determine where and what types of mosquitoes are active.

The control materials and methods used by MMCD are regularly tested for safety and only applied when surveillance indicates they would be effective. The active ingredients are specifically designed to target mosquito larvae or adults with minimal impacts on non-target insects. The control materials are not harmful to people, pets, or wildlife. DNR FalconCam

While the long-watched DNR eagle nest fell last season, the DNR has reported that a pair of peregrine falcons have an active nest and is tending eggs on their popular DNR FalconCam.

Falcons typically lay eggs in 48-72 hours intervals and eggs in the nest could start to hatch mid-May. Baby falcons, called eyasses, are lightly covered in whitish down. Eyasses initially have their eyes closed and are relatively helpless. Both male and female adults help incubate the eggs and provide food for their young.

The nest box is downtown St. Paul. The female is 11-year-old and a 15-year-old male and both will help incubate the eggs and provide food for their young.






