<u>REMINDERS – IN CASE YOU MISSED IT</u>

General ice safety / Ice Fishing prohibited in North Oaks

Just a reminder that fishing is prohibited on North Oaks lakes. For those of you who will ice fishing on neighboring lakes, consider the following tips from the DNR. No ice can ever be considered "safe ice," but following <u>these guidelines</u> can help minimize the risk:

- Always wear a life jacket or float coat on the ice (except when in a vehicle).
- Carry ice picks, rope, an ice chisel and tape measure.
- Check ice thickness at regular intervals; conditions can change quickly.
- Bring a cell phone or personal locator beacon.
- Don't go out alone; let someone know about trip plans and expected return time.
- Before heading out, inquire about conditions and known hazards with local experts.

The minimum ice thickness guidelines for new, clear ice are:

- 4 inches for ice fishing or other activities on foot.
- 5-7 inches for a snowmobile or all-terrain vehicle.
- 8-12 inches for a car or small pickup.
- 12-15 inches for a medium truck.
- Double these minimums for white or snow-covered ice.

Martin Luther King Day – City Office Closed

In observance of Martin Luther King federal holiday, the City office will be closed on Monday, January 17th, 2021.

City Council Meeting Summary

Highlights from last night's City Council include:

- Council members approved the 2022 City Hall Holiday Schedule and the 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Council also approved a CUP application for a home in excess of 35' in height for 3 Eastview Lane.
- Deputy Burrell reported that there was one car theft and a couple mail package thefts in the past month. He noted that neighboring cities have had numerous reports of thefts from autos. So far there have not been any in North Oaks, but residents are encouraged to keep an eye on this. Reports of fraud also continue to plague contract cities, but there have been no new reports of fraud in North Oaks in the last month. (*see new fraud video below under safety)
- City Forester Mark Rehder gave an update on forestry work in 2021. At present, Emerald Ash Borer is their primary focus. 25 Ash trees were marked in 2021. They will continue to work on their detection and notification process in 2022. Full report is included in the Council Packet.
- Council members approved a resolution to allow the membership of the Natural Resources Commission to allow not more than 9 members. They also approved the appointment of Addie Motta for a three-year term, and the reappointment of Andrew Hawkins for a 3-year term, and the appointment of Paul Ellis for a 2-year term.
- Council members approved Planning Commission appointments of Scott Wiens for a 3-year term, Robert Ostlund for a 3-year term and the reappointment of Nick Sandell for a 3-year term.
- Council approved the 2022 Fee Schedule Ordinance.

- An update was given as to VLAWMO 2022 priorities.
- Discussions will continue at the February meeting for selection of chair/vice chair of Natural Resource Commission for 2022.

Highlights from Planning Commission Meeting - 1/27/2022

- Welcomed new Planning Commissioners Scott Wiens, Robert Ostlund, and returning member Nick Sandell who were sworn in this week. Their terms will end December 31, 2024.
- The Planning Commission approved a septic variance for the property at 9 Ridge Road. The recommendation will go before City Council at the February 10th meeting.
- A CUP for the property at 14 Cherrywood Lane was tabled until next month's meeting. The applicant will work with city staff to resolve outstanding issues with the application.
- CUPs for properties at 6, 10, 14 and 16 Sherwood Trail were approved. They will go before City Council for final approval at the February meeting.
- The Planning Commission discussed the 2022 meeting schedule and decided to continue meeting on the last Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. They will consider adding special meeting times as necessary should business items require additional information and discussion.

Road Restrictions – Plan ahead

We are beginning to get calls inquiring when road restrictions will take effect. They are NOT currently in effect but you do need to plan ahead.

Please note that the City of North Oaks follows the State of Minnesota Department of Transportation guidance. While the 3 ton per axle restriction typically has gone into effect early-March in the past, we only receive a 48-hour notice from MN DOT of the date/time when restrictions take effect. As soon as we receive notice, we will publish this on the website, Facebook page, City eblast, North Oaks News, NOHOA eblast.

There are NO exceptions to the road restrictions during this period unless it is a surfacing septic system emergency. If you are anticipating large contractor deliveries within the next 8-10 weeks, **plan ahead now or delivery loads will need to be split into smaller trucks.**

<u>SAFETY</u>

Speed Limit in Rapp Farm reduced effective 2/1/2022

In December 2021, the City of North Oaks discussed speed limits and safety concerns brought forth by residents within the Rapp Farm Development. In August 2019, State Statutes changed authorizing cities to be the local road authority on their own City streets, therefore it was determined streets fall under City of North Oaks jurisdiction.

Speed limit changes are to be based on safety, engineering and traffic analysis. An engineering review was performed and after consultation with the NOHOA Board, it was determined a speed reduction from 30 MPH to 20 MPH on streets within the Rapp Farm Development is a reasonable approach to help reduce conflicts, the likelihood of being in a crash and the severity of crashes that do occur.

Therefore, the City Council will reduce the speed limit to 20 MPH within the Rapp Farm Development effective 2-1-2022. Speed limit signs have been posted at both Rapp Farm entrances.

Ordinance on ATV's and Snowmobiles

Just a reminder that per City Traffic and Parking Ordinance 70, all-terrain vehicles (ATV's) and snow mobiles are NOT allowed on City of North Oaks streets, NOHOA property and trails, or any other person's property. Refer to section 70 - 70.07 of the full ordinance for further details.

Coyotes -Breeding season

As we enter the spring, Coyotes may become more active with the mating season beginning in January and lasting through February. Five to seven pups are typically born in April and may be protective of their young. Please keep a careful watch on your pets when they are outside and as always, please keep your pets leashed on trails. If Coyotes do encroach your yard, make them feel as unwelcome as possible using hazing techniques such as loud noises, and yelling to encourage them to move on. Be a Hard Target - Do not Leave Cars Running

Late winter ideal time to prune trees

Pruning is a great way to prevent spread of diseases like oak wilt

Late winter is the ideal time to prune branches on trees, according to experts with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. When done correctly, pruning in the winter is less risky to tree health.

"Now through early March — just before trees come out of dormancy — is a great time to get outside and prune your trees," said Jennifer Teegarden, DNR cooperative forestry outreach specialist. "As trees become active in spring, they are able to quickly heal the pruning wound."

Wintertime pruning minimizes the risk that an open pruning wound could invite pests or diseases. Pruning oak trees should be avoided from April through July, when beetles that can spread oak wilt are feeding on tree sap, which is present at new wounds.

Tree pruning tips:

- Trim branches before they grow to 2 inches in diameter to minimize wound size and damage to the surrounding bark.
- Don't cut flush to the trunk. Preserving the branch collar (the area where the trunk slightly bulges around the branch) allows the wound to heal quickly and not decay.
- Use the three-cut method for larger branches to minimize damage to the bark. Information on this method can be found the <u>pruning trees and shrubs page of the University of Minnesota</u> <u>Extension website</u> (tinyurl.com/2p8c7bhv).

Pruning trees benefits yards and homes by:

- Reducing the need for a larger pruning job in the future and improving the tree's health.
- Helping trees survive storms with fewer dropped branches and less damage.
- Improving safety by removing branches that overhang or block walkways or roads.
- Maintaining the aesthetic of yards and enhancing the beauty of the tree.

Road Restrictions – Plan ahead

While the 3 ton per axle restriction typically has gone into effect early-March in the past, we only receive a 48-hour notice from MN DOT of the date/time when restrictions take effect. Speed Limit in Rapp Farm reduced effective 2/1/2022

In December 2021, the City of North Oaks discussed speed limits and safety concerns brought forth by residents within the Rapp Farm Development. Speed limit changes are to be based on safety, engineering and traffic analysis. An engineering review was performed and after consultation with the NOHOA Board, it was determined a speed reduction from 30 MPH to 20 MPH on streets within the Rapp Farm Development is a reasonable approach to help reduce conflicts, the likelihood of being in a crash and the severity of crashes that do occur.

Therefore, the City Council reduced the speed limit to 20 MPH within the Rapp Farm Development effective 2-1-2022. Speed limit signs have been posted at both Rapp Farm entrances.

Highlights from the 2/24/2022 Planning Commission Meeting

The Planning Commission is responsible for reviewing and bringing recommendations forth to City Council for final review and decision. All matters below will be discussed at the March 10th City Council 7 p.m. meeting for consideration.

- Motion approved to amend the fence screening ordinance 151.034 to allow up to 10-foot, solid fencing in the L1 Light Industrial District zoning district. This would allow NOHOA to enhance safety, provide additional shielding, and help limit trespassing at the maintenance center. Any additional comments on this issue can be sent to <u>kkress@northoaksmn.gov</u>.
- Conditional Use permit for extra height for new home construction at 14 Cherrywood Circle was denied based on setbacks. The Conditional use permit for garage space in excess of 1,500 square feet at this property was approved. Both CUP applications for height and garage space will move up to the City Council for final consideration.
- There was extensive discussion of guidelines to help quantify when a home is naturally suited for a walk out, to minimize impact on natural topography. Quantifiable Guidelines will help the Planning Commission and Council determine when a Conditional use permit for height can be granted while preserving the natural character of the area. The guidelines focus on having a minimum 6-8-foot difference in elevation difference between front of home and back of home with land in its natural state.
- After extensive discussion of revised plans and impact on natural topography, Conditional Use permit applications for height in excess of 35 feet for new homes at 6, 14, and 16 Sherwood Trail were approved. Application for 6 Sherwood Trail is now designed as a basement lookout, with 14 and 16 Sherwood Trail as walkouts.
- There will be a special Planning Commission meeting on Thursday, March 3rd at 7:00 p.m. to consider revised plans for the CUP for height at 10 Sherwood Trail.

Will look to schedule a resident town hall meeting on public safety with NOHOA. A core focus would be speeding, and distinguishing City public safety responsibilities according to state law and take them seriously.
- Approved Joint Powers Agreement with White Bear Township for maintenance of North Oaks Golf Course new sewer lift station.
- Discussed need for emergency sirens in our community. Working with Lake Johanna fire department to determine potential locations and how many may be needed. Each siren costs \$25,000 and Rapp Farm area is showing as a gap in coverage. Information will be communicated to get input from the community.
- Council interviewed and approved new City Planner Kendra Lindahl, from Landform.
- Starting with the January 2022 meeting, zoom links to re-watch the Natural Resource meetings have been added to each meeting entry on the city calendar. Residents are encouraged to participate in meetings, and/or <u>view meeting minutes</u>.

Road Restrictions Coming Next Week – Effective Wednesday, March 16th

The City of North Oaks has received notice from the State of Minnesota Department of Transportation that road restrictions go in effect beginning **12:01 a.m. on Wednesday March 16th, 2022**. During this period the 3 ton per axle restriction will be in effect. This period is determined by the MN Department

Coyotes -Breeding season – Use Caution

We have received our first report of a coyote encounter. As we enter the spring, Coyotes may become more active with the mating season beginning in January and lasting through February. Five to seven pups are typically born in April and may be protective of their young. Please keep a careful watch on your pets when they are outside and as always, please keep your pets leashed on trails. If Coyotes do encroach your yard, make them feel as unwelcome as possible using hazing techniques such as loud noises, and yelling to encourage them to move on.

- Approved a revision to Fence ordinance 151.034(b) to allow up to a 10-foot solid fence in the Limited Industrial district. This is in response to a request by NOHOA to help shield Mel's service center from neighbors and secure it from trespassers.
- Council discussed the possibly of a public safety committee and what the focus and charter could be. This would work in conjunction with NOHOA and the Ramsey County Sherriff's office, with the input of public without duplicating other existing initiatives. Will look to schedule a resident town hall meeting on public safety with NOHOA. A core focus would be speeding, and distinguishing City public safety responsibilities according to state law and take them seriously.
- Approved Joint Powers Agreement with White Bear Township for maintenance of North Oaks Golf Course new sewer lift station.
- Discussed need for emergency sirens in our community. Working with Lake Johanna fire department to determine potential locations and how many may be needed. Each siren costs \$25,000 and Rapp Farm area is showing as a gap in coverage. Information will be communicated to get input from the community.
- Council interviewed and approved new City Planner Kendra Lindahl, from Landform.
- Starting with the January 2022 meeting, zoom links to re-watch the Natural Resource meetings have been added to each meeting entry on the city calendar. Residents are encouraged to participate in meetings, and/or <u>view meeting minutes</u>.
- Councilors are working with attorneys through the mediation process to address the litigation with North Oaks Company regarding the proposed Gate Hill Subdivision.

• Council will schedule another Goal setting meeting / status check in April or May.

Overweight permit exceptions can only be granted through the North Oaks Homeowners association, 651-792-7765. Violations of road restrictions are subject to ticketing during this period.

DNR Rainfall Monitoring network seeks volunteer members

Reports provide important data about rainfall amounts, climate trends

The State Climatology Office is looking for volunteer rainfall monitors for the Community Collaborative Rain, Hail and Snow Network (CoCoRaHS). The network includes more than 20,000 volunteers nationwide who measure precipitation in their backyards using a standard 4-inch diameter rain gauge and submit reports online.

This is a great educational activity for families with kids and a rewarding hobby for anyone interested in weather or climate. Volunteers receive training on how to observe weather trends and submit their precipitation and weather event reports. All training material is available online.

Volunteers must purchase or provide a standard 4-inch diameter rain gauge (available at discount through CoCoRaHS) and have internet access to submit reports.

Jumping worms are invasive and destructive worms that can quickly degrade soils, kill garden plants and damage lawns. They look similar to nightcrawlers and other earthworms except that they wiggle intensely when disturbed and can appear to be jumping. If your soil appears granular like coffee grounds, you likely have jumping worms and should report the invasive species.

Prevent conflicts with Bears with these Spring tips

With bears emerging from hibernation in the coming weeks, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds homeowners to check their property for food sources that could attract bears. "Please take the time now to remove or secure anything that could attract a bear," said Eric Nelson, DNR wildlife damage program supervisor. "Prevention is key. Once a bear finds a food source, it will likely return again."

Avoid bear conflicts by following these tips:

Around the yard

- Any time you feed birds, you risk attracting bears. Avoid feeding birds from April 1 to Nov. 15. If you still wish to feed birds, hang birdfeeders 10 feet up and 4 feet out from the nearest trees.
- Do not put out feed for wildlife (like corn, oats, pellets or molasses blocks).
- Do not leave food from barbeques and picnics outdoors, especially overnight. Standard coolers are not bear-proof. Clean and store barbeque grills in a secure shed or garage away from windows and doors after each use.
- Harvest garden produce as it matures, pick any fruit left on trees and collect any fallen fruit. Locate gardens away from forests and shrubs that bears may use for cover.
- Store pet food inside and feed pets inside. If pets must be fed outdoors, feed them only as much as they will eat.

Coyotes -Breeding season – Use Caution

We have received our first report of a coyote encounter. As we enter the spring, Coyotes may become more active with the mating season beginning in January and lasting through February. Five to seven pups are typically born in April and may be protective of their young. Please keep a careful watch on your pets when they are outside and as always, please keep your pets leashed on trails. If Coyotes do encroach your yard, make them feel as unwelcome as possible using hazing techniques such as loud noises, and yelling to encourage them to move on.

Prevent conflicts with Bears with these Spring tips

With bears emerging from hibernation in the coming weeks, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds homeowners to check their property for food sources that could attract bears. "Please take the time now to remove or secure anything that could attract a bear," said Eric Nelson, DNR wildlife damage program supervisor. "Prevention is key. Once a bear finds a food source, it will likely return again."

Avoid bear conflicts by following these tips:

Around the yard

- Any time you feed birds, you risk attracting bears. Avoid feeding birds from April 1 to Nov. 15. If you still wish to feed birds, hang birdfeeders 10 feet up and 4 feet out from the nearest trees.
- Do not put out feed for wildlife (like corn, oats, pellets or molasses blocks).
- Do not leave food from barbeques and picnics outdoors, especially overnight. Standard coolers are not bear-proof. Clean and store barbeque grills in a secure shed or garage away from windows and doors after each use.
- Harvest garden produce as it matures, pick any fruit left on trees and collect any fallen fruit. Locate gardens away from forests and shrubs that bears may use for cover.
- Store pet food inside and feed pets inside. If pets must be fed outdoors, feed them only as much as they will eat.

Prevent the Spread of Avian Flu

- Clean and sanitize bird feeders and wait to put them back out until flu numbers go down.

CATGUARD Catalytic Converter Marking Pilot Program – Ramsey County Sherriffs Office

The Ramsey County Sheriff's Office has partnered with the Minnesota Commerce Fraud Bureau in a NEW Pilot Program, which includes a self-install marking kit of catalytic converters.

The labels are installed by sticking the label onto a - cool to the touch - catalytic converter. A fluid is then painted onto the label, which, once a vehicle is started, causes the unique number to be etched into the metal. Once registered, the unique number allows law enforcement to trace a converter back to a specific vehicle if a converter were to be stolen and later recovered. The law requires the labels be

installed at no cost to vehicle owners. Businesses cannot charge for the installation of a program label, but they can require another service, e.g., oil change, be performed to install a label.

The marking kits are free and available to residents of Arden Hills, Falcon Heights, Little Canada, North Oaks, Shoreview, Vadnais Heights, and White Bear Township.

Residents can come to the Ramsey County Sheriff's Office Patrol Station, 1411 Paul Kirkwold Dr. Arden Hills, starting **Monday May 9th from 9:00am to 4:00pm Monday through Friday**. The Crime Prevention Unit will have someone in the lobby to assist you in starting the registration process. You will need to bring ID, vehicle's insurance card or VIN and plate number for your vehicle. **Supplies are limited as this is a pilot project.**

The marking kits are **only for these vehicles** most at-risk for catalytic converter theft:

If your vehicle is on this list consider participating in this pilot program. If your vehicle is not on the list an alternative to the labels is to engrave your converter with the VIN, a partial VIN (the last 8), or even the license plate number. It is recommended to apply some bright colored high-temperature paint with the engraving. Just painting without adding identification marks does not help with the issue of traceability. Marking a catalytic converter will not prevent theft on its own. Follow safe practices and report thefts. Metropolitan Mosquito Control District was able to begin conducting larval control treatments by helicopter this week. Throughout the summer, helicopters will treat wetlands where technicians have found high numbers of mosquito larvae that impact humans to prevent them from becoming biting adult mosquitoes.

Today - Friday, May 6 - helicopters are active in all seven counties in the metro. A full list of cities with planned helicopter activity is published on their website by 8:00AM: <u>MMCD Planned Helicopter Activity</u> Helicopters apply a dry granule or pellet containing a natural soil bacterium or a mosquito growth regulator to wetlands and large areas of standing water to prevent larval mosquitoes from becoming biting adults. These are bio-rational control materials which specifically target mosquito larvae and pose

no risk to human or animal health. MMCD helicopters DO NOT apply liquid control materials that target adult mosquitoes. Learn more about our <u>mosquito control program</u>.

Bear sightings – Take down Feeders

Please note that black bear sightings have been reported near Raccoon Road/East Pleasant Lake Road on the east side of North Oaks area this week. During these times of year, typically late spring and early fall, please take down bird feeders that may be a source of food for Bears, and consider putting out garbage by 7:00 a.m. on the morning of pick up day instead of the night prior.

Tips from DNR for around the yard:

- Any time you feed birds, you risk attracting bears. Avoid feeding birds from April 1 to Nov. 15. If you still wish to feed birds, hang birdfeeders 10 feet up and 4 feet out from the nearest trees.
- Do not put out feed for wildlife (like corn, oats, pellets or molasses blocks).
- Do not leave food from barbeques and picnics outdoors, especially overnight. Standard coolers are not bear-proof. Clean and store barbeque grills in a secure shed or garage away from windows and doors after each use.
- Harvest garden produce as it matures, pick any fruit left on trees and collect any fallen fruit. Locate gardens away from forests and shrubs that bears may use for cover.
- Store pet food inside and feed pets inside. If pets must be fed outdoors, feed them only as much as they will eat.

This will remove easy food sources and encourage any bear to safely and naturally move along its path. Refer to the <u>tips from Ramsey County Sheriff's office</u> as well as <u>tips from the DNR on how we can</u> <u>do our part to minimize bear problems</u>. Graduation Party Etiquette / Ordinance

City regulations require guests to park on 1 side of the road only, in order to allow traffic to pass on our narrow roads. It does not matter which side of the road, just pick a side and instruct other guests to follow suit. City Ordinance § 71.12 PARKING. States: (A) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or a traffic-control device, no person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle upon the traveled portion of any street in the City other than as closely as is practical to the righthand edge or curb of the street, and unless there is left available at least 10 feet of the width of the traveled portion of the street for the free movement of vehicular traffic. In no case shall the stopping, - 14 - North Oaks- Traffic Code 14 standing, or parking of a vehicle be allowed unless the street opposite the vehicle is clear of any other vehicle stopped, standing, or parked and, in no event, shall the stopping, standing, or parking be permitted for more than 10 hours, whether consecutive or not, on any day of the year or for more than 2 hours between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and

6:00 a.m. Please also note that homeowner's association regulations do not allow for signage in the community. Please instruct your guests with directions as signs are subject to removal by NOHOA.

DNR advice for dealing with storm damaged trees

Cleanup following a storm can be an overwhelming task for homeowners. If trees have been damaged, knowing which to save and which to remove can enhance people's safety and the survival of remaining trees, according to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

When addressing storm-damaged trees:

Do:

- Use caution when approaching damaged trees. If there are downed wires, stay clear and call 911.
- Carefully inspect standing trees for damage and address hazardous trees first. Hazardous trees have detached or loosely hanging branches and split or cracked trunks that can cause injury or damage to property.
- Remove trees if more than 50% of the trunk or live branches in the crown are damaged, the tree is unnaturally leaning or roots are damaged, or the tree could injury people or damage property. If you're unsure if a tree should be removed or can be saved, consult with a certified arborist.
- Assess the size of the tree and pruning job and play it safe. Consult a certified arborist on medium and large branches, or whole tree removal. *Consult City Forester or Arborist if any work needs to be done. Do NOT prune oak trees during this high-risk period.
- Use proper pruning techniques to remove small, broken limbs by cutting just outside the branch collar, but limit pruning to the minimum amount necessary to address safety risks. Too much pruning can weaken an already stressed tree – and many trees are stressed due to last year's drought.
- Make sure damaged trees get rain or are watered weekly to help them repair and rebuild. Be careful not to overwater, especially in heavy clay soils the equivalent of 1 inch per week is ideal.
- Monitor damaged trees in upcoming years to make sure they don't decay or become a hazard.
- Don't be rushed by promises of bargains from inexperienced or unqualified tree service providers. Ask for references and proof of insurance.
- Repair a broken branch or fork of a tree with tape, wire, bolts or other wraps. The wound will not heal, and the split will invite decay and further weaken the tree. Cabling or bracing should only be performed by a certified arborist and inspected annually.
- Remove the tops of trees. This makes the tree more susceptible to insects and disease, and promotes the growth of new branches that are weakly attached.
- Apply paint or dressing to wounds, as these materials interfere with a tree's natural wound sealing process.
- Remove small, leaning trees. Trees less than 15 feet tall may survive if they are gently pulled back into place. Press out air spaces in the loosened soil. The tree can then be staked for up to a year.
- Fertilize stressed or damaged trees. Fertilizer can trigger rapid but weak growth and deplete the tree's energy reserves that are needed to recover from damage.

- Pick up small children and pets
- Face the bear directly and try to appear as large as possible
- Spread or wave your arms, ideally holding a sweater or coat
- Slowly back away and to the side (sideways is considered non-threatening movement).
- Talk in a calm, low and monotone voice.

Auto Theft Alert – Kia & Hyundai vehicles targeted by Thieves

Excerpt from Ramsey county Sheriff Neighborhood Watch July 2022 newsletter Kia's built 2011-2021 and Hyundai built 2015-2021, which are manufactured by the same parent company, have security vulnerabilities which allow the vehicles to be more easily stolen. Hyundai and Kia have made changes beginning with their 2022 models by installing engine immobilizers and other fixes. Cars with push button start or an engine immobilizer are harder to steal.

Recommendations for Hyundai & Kia owners to prevent theft:

1. Purchase and utilize a steering wheel lock (while not a perfect solution it is a visual deterrent).

2. Purchase and install a secondary alarm system for the vehicle.

3. Keep your vehicle in a secure location instead of parking on the street or in the driveway. If you must park on a public street, try to park under a streetlight.

4. Don't leave anything of value in your car — wallets, phones, personal identification, keys, title, power cords — take them with you when leaving your vehicle.

5. Lock vehicle doors when you are away from, and in the car.

No car is impossible to steal. Your only hope is to make your car more difficult so thieves will move on to the next. To help stop these and other crimes report any suspicious activity to 911. If you encounter a break-in or theft in progress, dial 911 immediately and do not approach

No Fishing Allowed

- Officer Pam Lee gave a report on recent incidents in the neighborhood, including several acts of vandalism, trespassing/solicitation and speeding along North Oaks Road.

Auto Theft Alert – Kia & Hyundai vehicles targeted by Thieves

Excerpt from Ramsey county Sheriff Neighborhood Watch July 2022 newsletter

Kia's built 2011-2021 and Hyundai built 2015-2021, which are manufactured by the same parent company, have security vulnerabilities which allow the vehicles to be more easily stolen. Hyundai and Kia have made changes beginning with their 2022 models by installing engine immobilizers and other fixes. Cars with push button start or an engine immobilizer are harder to steal.

Recommendations for Hyundai & Kia owners to prevent theft:

1. Purchase and utilize a steering wheel lock (while not a perfect solution it is a visual deterrent).

2. Purchase and install a secondary alarm system for the vehicle.

3. Keep your vehicle in a secure location instead of parking on the street or in the driveway. If you must park on a public street, try to park under a streetlight.

4. Don't leave anything of value in your car — wallets, phones, personal identification, keys, title, power cords — take them with you when leaving your vehicle.

5. Lock vehicle doors when you are away from, and in the car.

No car is impossible to steal. Your only hope is to make your car more difficult so thieves will move on to the next. To help stop these and other crimes report any suspicious activity to 911. If you encounter a break-in or theft in progress, dial 911 immediately and do not approach

No Fishing Regulation

Just a reminder, fishing is not permitted by residents or guests of residents of the City of North Oaks as per <u>Minnesota Natural Resources Department Statute 6262.0500</u>, "WATERS CLOSED TO TAKING FISH. Our City's waters are permanently closed to taking of all fish at all times." Those caught fishing will be ticketed and are subject to paying a fine.

The DNR may periodically take fish from Pleasant Lake for testing purposes or for display in Minnesota State Fair tanks. Good news: There are 10,000 other lakes in Minnesota where you can fish! Check out nearby lakes such as Turtle Lake, Snail Lake, or Snail Lake Regional Park.

Caring for Trees in Drought Conditions

Did you know that trees need the equivalent of at least one inch of rain each week? The Minnesota DNR offers the following tips for caring for trees during drought conditions:

- Filling a water bag placed around your tree is the easiest method.
- Water in the early morning or late at night to reduce evaporation and conserve water.
- Use a soaker hose to cover the ground under the canopy of the tree until the top 6 inches of soil are damp. This is a great approach for mature trees!
- Trickle water from the hose, rotating the hose around the tree for 15 minutes on all four sides of the tree.
- Grab a 5-gallon bucket and very slowly dump a bucket over the tree roots about 25 gallons over a day or two should do the trick. Just remember to do it every week!

What is a Solicitor?

The community has experienced several reports of soliciting this week. A solicitor is an uninvited person in our private community putting materials on door knobs / mailboxes, or knocking on doors. This applies to both contractors soliciting business, as well as individuals promoting different social causes or political parties. Per <u>City Ordinance 131</u>, these individuals are trespassing in our community since they are not residents or invited guests. Doing work on a home nearby does not give permission for contractors to knock on neighbors' doors. To reach our residents, these materials must be sent through U.S. Mail system or advertised in the local paper.

Report solicitors to Ramsey County via 911 or the non-emergency #651-291-1111. Please note the description of car, license plate, and description of persons if possible.

Please note that candidates for local North Oaks office such as Mayor and City Council are residents of our community and therefore are not trespassing. Local candidates may drop information in newspaper slots on mailboxes, however we do ask they do NOT approach doorways.

Candidate Information / Political Guidelines

With the November election ballot for local North Oaks City offices set, candidates will be invited to record a 5 minute "Speak Out" presentation by NineNorth, and well as participate in the League of Women Voters candidate forum. Please note that candidates for local North Oaks office such as Mayor and City Council are residents of our community and therefore are not trespassing. Local candidates may drop information in newspaper slots on mailboxes, however we do ask they do NOT approach doorways.

Press Release City of North Oaks FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE September 16, 2022

The Honorable Patrick C. Diamond, Ramsey County District Court Judge, entered an order dismissing a lawsuit brought by the North Oaks Company against the City of North Oaks on September 13, 2022.

The Company sued the City, challenging the denial of final plat approval for the Gate Hill Subdivision. The City denied the application primarily on the basis it did not comply with the 1999 Development Agreement, which governed density and development standards.

During the course of litigation, the Company attempted to expand the litigation to include Red Forest Way South Phase 1, and a number of ancillary issues. Following the Company's agreement to comply with all the conditions recommended by the City Engineer and City Planner for both developments, the lawsuit was dismissed by stipulation of the parties to avoid the cost and expense of further litigation. All claims for damages, attorney's fees, and costs were dismissed.

The League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust retained legal counsel to defend the City in this matter. The City has confirmed that this litigation will not affect the City's future insurance premiums.

The City is pleased to have resolved this litigation and looks forward to working cooperatively with the Company in the future.

Health Officials concerned by increase of Measles Cases in State

Parents urged to make sure children are up to date on immunizations

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is working with local public health agencies and health care providers in the Twin Cities area to investigate 13 cases of measles that occurred June through September among several different families with unvaccinated children. Most of these children had a history of travel to a country where measles is common and circulating. The most recent case did not have a reported travel history, but investigators are still working to determine how transmission may have occurred. All cases are in the Twin Cities area. The children have been as young as two years old to children in their early teens, and just over a third are pre-teen. Seven children were hospitalized for treatment of measles.

Minnesota's 13 cases are several times greater than the number of cases the state sees in a typical year. Measles spreads easily by coughing, talking, or being in the same room with someone who has measles. Initial symptoms of measles include a high fever, cough, runny nose, and watery eyes followed by a rash that typically spreads from the head to the rest of the body. It generally takes 8 to 12 days from exposure to someone with measles to the first symptom, which is usually fever. The measles rash usually appears two to three days after the fever begins. If you have symptoms of measles, call your doctor or clinic and they will let you know if you need to come in for a visit.

The best way to prevent measles is through vaccination. Children should receive two doses of MMR vaccine: The first at 12 to 15 months of age, and the second at 4 to 6 years of age. Children 6 to 12 months should get an early dose of MMR vaccine if they are traveling to a country where measles is common. For all ages, it is important to talk to your doctor if you are going to be <u>traveling to another</u> <u>country</u>. Your doctor can check to make sure you and your family are up to date on your immunizations and make sure you do not need any other immunizations.

MDH encourages people to check their records to confirm that they and their children have received the MMR vaccine. Minnesotans can request their vaccination records by visiting <u>Find My Immunization</u> <u>Record</u>.

The Honorable Patrick C. Diamond, Ramsey County District Court Judge, entered an order dismissing a lawsuit brought by the North Oaks Company against the City of North Oaks on September 13, 2022.

The Company sued the City, challenging the denial of final plat approval for the Gate Hill Subdivision. The City denied the application primarily on the basis it did not comply with the 1999 Development Agreement, which governed density and development standards. During the course of litigation, the Company attempted to expand the litigation to include Red Forest Way South Phase 1, and a number of ancillary issues. Following the Company's agreement to comply with all the conditions recommended by the City Engineer and City Planner for both developments, the lawsuit was dismissed by stipulation of the parties to avoid the cost and expense of further litigation. All claims for damages, attorney's fees, and costs were dismissed.

The League of Minnesota Cities Insurance Trust retained legal counsel to defend the City in this matter. The City has confirmed that this litigation will not affect the City's future insurance premiums.

The City is pleased to have resolved this litigation and looks forward to working cooperatively with the Company in the future.

Cold Water Safety

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds anyone whose autumn plans include spending time on or around the water to keep safety in mind. While more boating-related accidents happen during the summer, boating fatalities are higher during the cold-water season.

As water temperatures drop, water-based activities become riskier. A fall into a cold lake, pond or river can result in even a strong swimmer becoming incapacitated quickly. Further, cries for help can go unheard and rescues can take longer than in the warm-weather months when more people are on or near the water.

The easiest and most effective way to stay safe and survive a fall into the water is to wear a life jacket. Having a life jacket "nearby" will not help in an accidental fall. Foam life jackets are the best option when the water is cold because inflatable life jackets may not fully inflate.

Changes in weather that result in shifting winds and storms can also lead to a treacherous situation, so it's vital for anglers, hunters and others recreating on or near the water to keep an eye to the sky.

Drought Conditions throughout Minnesota – Help conserve our Natural Resources

With drought expanding and a portion of the state now in extreme drought, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is carefully monitoring the situation and taking steps as outlined in the <u>Minnesota</u> <u>Statewide Drought Plan</u>.

The weekly U.S. Drought Monitor map released Thursday, Oct. 13 shows:

- 43% of Minnesota is experiencing abnormally dry conditions, unchanged from last week.
- 24% of the state is in moderate drought, up from 23% last week.
- 8% is in severe drought, unchanged from last week.
- 4% is in extreme drought, unchanged from last week.

The current U.S. Drought Monitor map for Minnesota is available on the <u>drought page of the DNR</u> <u>website</u> (mndnr.gov/Climate/Drought).

Areas currently experiencing extreme drought will require at least five to eight inches of rain over several weeks to replenish water resources, and areas experiencing severe drought will require at least three to five inches of rain over several weeks to replenish water resources.

Minnesotans are encouraged to learn how much water they are using

(mndnr.gov/Waters/WaterMgmt_Section/Appropriations/Conservation.html) and identify ways to reduce water use. Reducing use today saves water for the future.

Cold Water Safety

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds anyone whose autumn plans include spending time on or around the water to keep safety in mind. While more boating-related accidents happen during the summer, boating fatalities are higher during the cold-water season.

As water temperatures drop, water-based activities become riskier. A fall into a cold lake, pond or river can result in even a strong swimmer becoming incapacitated quickly. Further, cries for help can go unheard and rescues can take longer than in the warm-weather months when more people are on or near the water.

The easiest and most effective way to stay safe and survive a fall into the water is to wear a life jacket. Having a life jacket "nearby" will not help in an accidental fall. Foam life jackets are the best option when the water is cold because inflatable life jackets may not fully inflate.

Changes in weather that result in shifting winds and storms can also lead to a treacherous situation, so it's vital for anglers, hunters and others recreating on or near the water to keep an eye to the sky.

Coyote

As leaves start to fall and wildlife becomes more visible, coyote may be seen. In order to discourage coyotes from taking up residence on your property, it is important to remove potential food sources, cut back brush and lowest tree limbs because it may attract the type of wildlife coyotes thrive on. Make them as unwelcome as possible by making menacing noises, throw something to scare it away, and keep pets on leash supervised during this period. Before we know it, wildlife (and us) will be hunkered down for the winter.

Highlights from the Thursday, 10/13/22 City Council Meeting

- City Council approved consent items including: September 2022 City financials, mechanical and arborist licenses, and minutes from the special Council meeting on 4.26.22 and Regular meeting on 9.8.2022.
- Ramsey County Sherriff Lee's report included an attempted theft via an open garage service door this week. The burglary attempt was scared off by neighbors. Separately, suspects in a traffic stop at Village Center area were found to have catalytic converters and other theft materials. They were apprehended.
- There was an update and discussion on the Charley Lake Homeowners Association water connection project.
- Council approved Councilmember Hara and Administrator Kress to work together to discuss potential upgrades to Council chambers including tables, background wall, paint and wall art.
- Council passed <u>Ordinance 140 to place a moratorium on sale of cannabis products</u> within the City of North Oaks.
- Councilor Reports included updates on:
 - St. Paul Water authority/VLAWMO meeting to discuss water quality in our watershed.
 - Meeting with White Bear Township to discuss water conservation measures and public education.
 - Councilors, City Staff, NOHOA, City Forester and North Oaks Company meetings both onsite and offsite regarding Red Forest Way. Discussed value of having City Forester available to meet with new property owners as they design / implement new homes to advise of best practices to preserve root systems of significant trees where possible.
 - City met with NOHOA who articulated support for traffic calming measures that could be used seasonally and moveable. NOHOA / City engineers to discuss best location and implementation. Options include: temporary crosswalks, speed humps, and speed cushions with lifespan of items ranging from 9 months to several years of use.
 - \circ $\;$ Update on renovation project in City office.
 - City Administrator Kress will request DNR permits and tags for deer program.
 NRC/Council then to decide on whether/how to implement a program this season.
 There have also been substantial discussions about dangerous road locations in the community such as Ski/Buffalo/Sunset.
 - City Engineers actively working on the many construction projects in the area such as Gate Hill, Red Forest Way, Hill Farm, etc. Meeting weekly with North Oaks Company,

City, and NOHOA making tweaks as needed to address any concerns and preserve trees where possible. Paving at Gate Hill may occur within the next week.

Crimes of Opportunity - Be a Hard Target

Drought Conditions throughout Minnesota – Help conserve our Natural Resources

With drought expanding and a portion of the state now in extreme drought, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is carefully monitoring the situation and taking steps as outlined in the <u>Minnesota</u> <u>Statewide Drought Plan</u>.

The weekly U.S. Drought Monitor map released Thursday, Oct. 13 shows:

- 43% of Minnesota is experiencing abnormally dry conditions, unchanged from last week.
- 24% of the state is in moderate drought, up from 23% last week.
- 8% is in severe drought, unchanged from last week.
- 4% is in extreme drought, unchanged from last week.

The current U.S. Drought Monitor map for Minnesota is available on the <u>drought page of the DNR</u> <u>website</u> (mndnr.gov/Climate/Drought).

Areas currently experiencing extreme drought will require at least five to eight inches of rain over several weeks to replenish water resources, and areas experiencing severe drought will require at least three to five inches of rain over several weeks to replenish water resources.

Minnesotans are encouraged to <u>learn how much water they are using</u> (mndnr.gov/Waters/WaterMgmt_Section/Appropriations/Conservation.html) and identify ways to reduce water use. Reducing use today saves water for the future.

World Stroke Day October 29

In honor of World Stroke Day on October 29th, the Minnesota Department of Health encourages everyone to learn the warning signs and get help immediately. Because "time lost can be brain loss", it is important to know the signs of stroke and err on the side of safety and call 9-1-1.

An easy way to remember how to recognize a stroke is "BE FAST:"

B – Balance loss. Does the person have sudden loss of balance or coordination?

E – Eyesight changes. Is eyesight suddenly blurred or double? Is there a sudden loss of vision?

F - Face drooping. Does tone side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile.

A – Arm weakness. Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

S – Speech difficulty. Is speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they are they hard to understand?

T – Time to call 9-1-1. If the person shows ANY of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get them to a hospital immediately.

World Stroke Day October 29

In honor of World Stroke Day on October 29th, the Minnesota Department of Health encourages everyone to learn the warning signs and get help immediately. Because "time lost can be brain loss", it is important to know the signs of stroke and err on the side of safety and call 9-1-1.

An easy way to remember how to recognize a stroke is "BE FAST:"

- B Balance loss. Does the person have sudden loss of balance or coordination?
- E Eyesight changes. Is eyesight suddenly blurred or double? Is there a sudden loss of vision?
- F Face drooping. Does tone side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile.

A – Arm weakness. Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

S – Speech difficulty. Is speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they are they hard to understand?

T – Time to call 9-1-1. If the person shows ANY of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get them to a hospital immediately.

Safety reminders for the Holiday Season

From the November, 2022 Ramsey County Sheriff's Office Block Captain Newsletter: Nothing can ruin the holiday spirit faster than becoming a victim of crime. Unfortunately, the holiday season is a time of opportunity for thieves to burglarize your home for cash, credit cards and gifts.

Prevent theft from your vehicle:

• Don't leave valuables in your vehicle.

• Always lock your car, and park in a well-lit and well-traveled area.

• When running errands, shopping, or traveling, make an extra stop before arriving at your destination to lock valuables in your trunk.

• If you must leave personal property in your vehicle, make sure it is out of view.

• Be aware in parking lots. Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle, ready to unlock the door.

Package theft prevention:

- Ask a trustworthy neighbor to watch for and retrieve your package when it is delivered.
- Request "signature required" service from the delivery company.

• Place a storage container, such as a large Rubbermaid, on your stoop for packages to be placed in so they are not readily seen by people driving by.

- Place a note on front door asking delivery driver to leave packages on the back steps.
- Have packages delivered to your work or a business address if possible.
- Deposit outgoing mail in official USPS drop boxes.

Financial card and online shopping considerations:

• If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well-lit and in a safe location.

• Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash.

• Keep your personal information private and your password secure. Do not respond to requests to verify your password or credit card information unless you initiated the contact. Legitimate businesses will not contact you in this manner.

Home security and safety tips:

• Don't display wrapped boxes under a lighted tree in the front window for thieves to see as they drive past your home.

• Don't pile up-empty gift boxes from your new computers, televisions, game systems and other electronics in front of your home on garbage day. Thieves will appreciate knowing that you have expensive gifts inside your home for them to steal. Instead, break down boxes and conceal the advertising when setting them out for recycling.

• Do NOT post your activities (gifts or plans to be away from home) on social media pages.

• Turn on outside lights to deter burglars.

Ice Safety

From the Minnesota DNR: As fall gives way to winter, it's vital to keep ice safety in mind anytime you're on or near the water

Please remember that ice seldom freezes uniform, especially early in the season and that a variety of factors — including air temperature, snow cover, currents, springs and fish – have an impact.

Wait for at least 4 inches of clear, solid ice to form. If you're in an area with more ice coverage, check the ice thickness before you head out, and as you go with an ice chisel.

In addition, tell someone else where you're going, carry along ice picks and a rope, and wear a life jacket or buoyant gear. If you fall through the ice into cold water, a life jacket will keep your head above the surface and give you time to assess the situation and get yourself out of trouble. From the November, 2022 Ramsey County Sheriff's Office Block Captain Newsletter: Nothing can ruin the holiday spirit faster than becoming a victim of crime. Unfortunately, the holiday season is a time of opportunity for thieves to burglarize your home for cash, credit cards and gifts.

Prevent theft from your vehicle:

Don't leave valuables in your vehicle. Always lock your car, and park in a well-lit and well-traveled area. When running errands, shopping, or traveling, make an extra stop before arriving at your destination to lock valuables in your trunk. If you must leave personal property in your vehicle, make sure it is out of view. Be aware in parking lots. Have your keys in hand when approaching your vehicle, ready to unlock the door.

Package theft prevention:

Ask a trustworthy neighbor to watch for and retrieve your package when it is delivered. Request "signature required" service from the delivery company. Place a storage container, such as a large Rubbermaid, on your stoop for packages to be placed in so they are not readily seen by people driving by. Place a note on front door asking delivery driver to leave packages on the back steps. Have

packages delivered to your work or a business address if possible. Deposit outgoing mail in official USPS drop boxes.

Financial card and online shopping considerations:

If you go to an automatic teller machine for cash, check for people around and make sure it is well-lit and in a safe location. Carry only the credit cards you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Keep your personal information private and your password secure. Do not respond to requests to verify your password or credit card information unless you initiated the contact. Legitimate businesses will not contact you in this manner.

Home security and safety tips:

Don't display wrapped boxes under a lighted tree in the front window for thieves to see as they drive past your home. Don't pile up-empty gift boxes from your new computers, televisions, game systems and other electronics in front of your home on garbage day. Thieves will appreciate knowing that you have expensive gifts inside your home for them to steal. Instead, break down boxes and conceal the advertising when setting them out for recycling. Do NOT post your activities (gifts or plans to be away from home) on social media pages. Turn on outside lights to deter burglars.

Please remember that ice seldom freezes uniform, especially early in the season and that a variety of factors — including air temperature, snow cover, currents, springs and fish – have an impact.

Wait for at least 4 inches of clear, solid ice to form. If you're in an area with more ice coverage, check the ice thickness before you head out, and as you go with an ice chisel.

In addition, tell someone else where you're going, carry along ice picks and a rope, and wear a life jacket or buoyant gear. If you fall through the ice into cold water, a life jacket will keep your head above the surface and give you time to assess the situation and get yourself out of trouble. Tips for Disposing of Holiday Wrapping

From the Green Ramsey County Newsletter:

Packages, boxes, bags, cards; The holidays can be filled with single-use items. Make sure you know how to properly dispose of them.

Think reuse first: What can you use again before disposing? Save bows, gift bags and tissue paper that can be reused. Think of creative ways to package gifts that don't require new materials.

Holiday cards: Cards and envelopes made of only paper should be placed in the curbside recycling bin or your apartment's recycling collection. Cards with foil, glitter, ribbons or velvet are not recyclable and should be placed in the trash.

Cards that light up or play music do not belong in the trash because they contain batteries. Bring them to the year-round household hazardous waste collection site for free.

Highlights from the Thursday, December 8th Truth in Taxation and City Council Meeting

Highlights from Thursday's Truth-in-Taxation and City Council meeting include:

- Held a public hearing for the proposed 2023 budget and tax levy. Council approved Resolution 1470 setting the 2023 Budget and tax levy. The levy has been set at \$2,182,645, which is a tax rate of 11.53%. This is the one of the lowest tax rates in 10 years. Residents should see a reduction in their City taxes for 2023.
