Recycling Overflow due to Holidays

The City Hall has been fielding daily phone calls regarding confusion on recycling pickups for the past 2 weeks.

Just a reminder, there have been **NO recycling day shifts** these past 2 holiday weeks - pickups have occurred on schedule. If you missed your pickup day and have run out of room in your recycling can, please set overflow next to the recycling bin. (Please place overflow separate from the garbage can so it is clear it is recycling.)

As a general rule: when in doubt, have it out on your normal day by 7:00 a.m. With having 1,900 homes in North Oaks, the recycler is unable to make repeat visits to homes if you have it out on the wrong day or late. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.



Winter Weather / 2024 Recycling Calendar

As winter weather picks up and it becomes more difficult for recycling trucks to navigate winter roads, cul-de-sacs and driveways, please be sure to have your recycling cart at the curb no later than 7 a.m. to ensure pickup. On rare occasion, if there are icy / dangerous conditions for backing up trucks, pickups may be delayed or cancelled. If there are any widespread impacts to recycling, the City will post this information in the Red Alert bar on the City website homepage.

Also, the new 2024 Recycling Calendar been updated on the City website, and a physical mailer will also be sent to resident mailboxes as part of the annual Ramsey County recycling flyer. During the year 2024, the weeks in which there will be shifts to recycling will be:

- 4th of July
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas

Reminders will be published in the North Oaks Newspaper, City website, Facebook page, and this e-blast in the weeks prior to each recycling shift.

[Lake / Ice Safety Tips](#)

With the winter weather being unseasonably warm, it is natural for kids to want to be outside, and water and ice tends to be a natural draw. Please remind children of these dangers and to keep off the North Oaks Lakes. Many of the lakes, including but not limited to Charley Lake, Pleasant Lake, and Lake Gilfillan, have running water/aeration that makes ice thickness very unpredictable.



The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds everyone that where there is ice, its thickness this time of year is highly variable and subject to the whims of Mother Nature. And where ice hasn't formed – or where it freezes at night and opens during the day – the water temperature is so low that an unexpected fall in can be deadly. First Free Park Day of 2024 at MN State Parks

Looking for something to do when the kids are off school on MLK Day? The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is waiving vehicle permit fees at all 75 state parks and recreation areas on Monday, Jan. 15.

With this year's unusual weather, it's good to know there are many winter park activities that don't require snow or ice, such as birding, winter hiking, nature photography, and having a campfire with hot chocolate and s'mores.

And, if sufficient snow arrives before Jan. 15, visitors can also partake in popular winter activities like sledding, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing. Most parks offer snowshoe rentals, and select parks offer ski rentals. Visitors looking for rental equipment or certain recreational opportunities can use the **ParkFinder** tool (mndnr.gov/parkfinder) to find the best park for their trip.

The DNR recommends visitors wear clothing appropriate for the weather, and bring water and snacks. If trails could be icy, traction devices for footwear are useful.

This "Free Park Day" is one of four days each year on which the DNR waives the requirement for a vehicle permit at state parks and recreation areas. There is one fee-free day for each season of the year, giving Minnesotans a free of charge opportunity to experience the parks and recreation areas at different times of the year.

Four free park days are scheduled for Minnesota state parks and recreation areas in 2024 including:

- Monday, Jan. 15
- Saturday, April 27
- Saturday, June 8
- Friday, Nov. 29

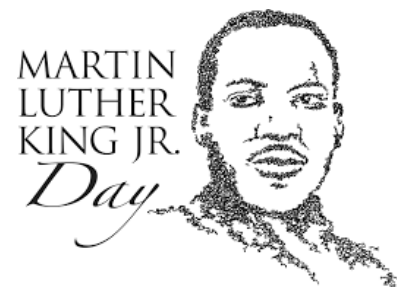

Highlights of North Oaks Safety and Security Discussion

On Thursday, January 11th, members of the Safety & Security Task force held a public meeting to gain input and



discuss a proposed pilot program for license plate readers at six of the North Oaks entrances.

Highlights included:

- Councilor Shuman gave an overview of the three-pronged initiative that he has proposed to increase the security for the community: expanding the Neighborhood Watch program, adopting an Emergency Management System (EMS) for emergency communications, and a pilot program for a License Plate Recognition (LPR) camera system at the six busiest entrance points in the community. The first two elements of this proposal are underway, but the LPR camera system pilot has not yet been approved.
- Undersheriff **Mike Martin** from the Ramsey County Sheriff's department shared that the RCSO supports the LPR camera pilot program. LPRs allow law enforcement to respond to crime quickly and can also be configured to help law enforcement respond to trespassing in cases of stalking, restraining orders, etc. RCSO uses LPR data immediately after crimes are reported, and records are maintained of who has accessed the data. He clarified that LPR systems are NOT configured to photograph a driver or identify race of a driver in any way. LPRs also allow law enforcement in surrounding cities to work together to address crime because various LPR systems can share data. LPRs assist in prosecuting crime by giving law enforcement evidence that places a vehicle in the location of the crime at the time it was committed.
- City Attorney Nason gave an overview of data access and privacy issues. Data created, collected and maintained from the LPR cameras pursuant to a contract between the City and the vendor would be subject to the Minnesota Data Privacy Act, which states that LPR data is considered private data. Data collected from a LPR system must be destroyed no later than 60 days from the date of collection unless it is being used in an investigation. If the City receives a civil subpoena for the LPR data, it can respond accordingly. There is a process for objecting to the discovery of data pursuant to a court order.
- Citizens shared comments in support of the program, including experiences where LPR data could have or did help solve crime that they had experienced. Others shared concerns about the program, including the cost given the low crime rate in the community, concern that the program does not do enough to deter crime, a request that there be clear data and metrics for how the program will be evaluated for success, as well as a request for clarity on what role the City and NOHOA would play in the LPR pilot program.
- No decisions to move forward with the LPR program were made at the meeting. Council is still gathering

City Council Meeting

Highlights from the January 11, 2024 City Council meeting include:

- Council approved the consent agenda, including arborist and mechanical license applications, the December 2023 meeting minutes, the 2024 City Hall Holiday Schedule, City financials, a resolution accepting donations for the December Age-Friendly Grant Open House, a resolution approving a GIS and interactive website for the Master Infrastructure Plan and the NYFS annual contract.
- Cedar Creek Energy gave a presentation on solar systems and the differences between ground-mounted solar and roof-mounted residential systems. This presentation was requested in response to a request from Incarnation Lutheran Church to install a ground-mounted system in their parking lot. This would be the first ground-mounted system in the city.
- Council approved the City Council meeting schedule for 2024 to meet on the second Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. This is the same schedule as in previous years.
- Council approved the Annual Appointment Resolution to assign council members to various committees for the year.
- A Public Hearing was held for an Ordinance adopting the 2024 Fee Schedule. There were no comments. The only changes are to the water and sewer rates for those receiving water and sewer from Shoreview and White Bear Township.
- Mayor Wolter shared that the Master Infrastructure Plan group continues to meet, and that they will have a joint meeting with NOHOA on Tuesday, January 16th to keep them in the loop on the progress. City Administrator Kress indicated that the primary focus of the meeting will be pavement standards, road standards, as well as sewer



and water utilities.

Feature Article: Ramsey County Sheriff's Office Scam Impersonators

Have you received a call recently from a Ramsey County Deputy? The Ramsey County Sheriff's Office has been getting reports over the last few months that Deputies names have been used by scammers. The scammers are using real Deputies names, badge numbers, phone numbers, and other office information when making scamming calls in order to sound official and legitimate.

So how do you determine if the person on the phone is a scammer or law enforcement? First, law enforcement will not contact community members by telephone to "demand" any form of payment or request any "personal or sensitive information." If there is any legal action by Ramsey County it will be done in person by a uniformed law enforcement officer, such as, the Ramsey County Sheriff's Office Civil Unit who serves all of Ramsey County's legal papers.

The Federal Trade Commission recommends these tips to avoid government scam:

- Don't ever wire money or use gift cards, cryptocurrency, or payment app to pay someone who says they work for the government.
- Don't give your financial or personal information to someone who calls, texts, emails, or messages you on social media and says they're with the government.
- Don't trust your caller ID.

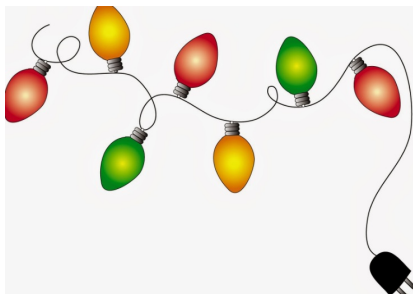
